



Scope and Sequence for Literary Adventures for Kids Online Book Clubs

Program Title: Ned the Internet Troll Online Book Club

Grade Level(s): Elementary

Subject Area: Language Arts

Course Description:

This course offers a month-long immersive study of a picture book. It integrates literature, grammar, vocabulary, and writing through engaging rabbit trails, hands-on projects, and critical thinking. Students will build connections between literature and real-world topics, deepen their reading comprehension, and develop creative writing skills inspired by the stories.

Educational Objectives:

Students will:

- Develop critical reading and comprehension skills.
- Expand their vocabulary and apply new words in written and oral communication.
- Improve grammar and spelling through copywork and dictation.
- Enhance critical thinking and analytical skills through discussion and writing.
- Build connections between literature and other disciplines, such as history, math, and art.

Weekly Breakdown:

Week 1:

- **Focus:** Introduction to the story
- **Activities:** Reading assignment, vocabulary practice, copywork/dictation, rabbit trail exploration, and hands-on "magic dust" project

Week 2:

- **Focus:** Deep dive into the story
- **Activities:** Reading assignment, vocabulary practice, copywork/dictation, rabbit trail exploration, and hands-on "magic dust" project

Week 3:

- **Focus:** Expanding understanding and exploration
- **Activities:** Reading assignment, vocabulary practice, copywork/dictation, rabbit trail exploration, and hands-on "magic dust" project

Week 4:

- **Focus:** Wrapping up and celebrating
- **Activities:** Reading assignment, vocabulary practice, copywork/dictation, rabbit trail exploration, celebration of finishing the book, and creative writing project

Materials Used:

- **Primary Texts:** *Ned the Internet Troll* by Paul Castle
- **Supplemental Resources:** Online lessons, activity guides, and optional worksheets (provided within the course).

Assessment Methods:

- **Informal Assessments:** Discussion participation, creative project completion, vocabulary quizzes
- **Formal Assessments:** Writing project submissions
- **Parental Feedback:** Opportunity for parents to evaluate progress and provide input on student learning

Program Outcomes:

By the end of this course, students will have:

- Developed a love of literature through creative and immersive learning.
- Strengthened language arts skills, including vocabulary, grammar, and writing.
- Gained confidence in discussing and analyzing complex themes.
