Moving Forward

Text: Job 42:12a Exodus 14:13-16a 2 Timothy 1:7

Introduction: I Want To Ask A Question?

As believers can we **change completely**, **NOT** improve, **but** a **wholesale redefinition** of who we are? Can we make a total course correction so that we can follow **a path** and pursue **a destiny** we haven't **even considered**? Can we have a Job like "**do-over**" experience; where after disaster struck Job; Job's second half of life was better than his first?

God wants us as sons and daughters to experience continual restarts and rebirths. He wants us to literally rebrand our lives. God never meant for the totality of who we are to be boring. He intended for us to experience the excitement and inspiration that comes from perpetual transformation. (John 10:10 NIV)

Kingdom living is a life of faith where we achieve and fail, rise and fall, suffer and recover, loose and gain, and then after having done all, we still fulfill our destiny. This transformative experience or journey is what it means to "move forward with God".

Moving forward with God is what makes Christianity a growth religion in comparison with other belief systems. It is impossible for us to focus on God through Jesus Christ and remain the same people. When we read, pray, worship and obey, the Holy Spirit is going to change us. He will set us free from who we have been so we can become who we are meant to be in God! (Key-transformation)

Challenges to Change:

If Christianity is a growth religion, then why is change so difficult for us? Why doesn't God just make it easier, so we can grow into the people we are meant to become?

I believe there are many reasons why change is hard, but I find that the primary reason is our personal resistance to moving on and moving forward. Learning new things is not the difficult part, but letting go of the old things, how we use to do things, and the comfort of what people think we ought to be; that's the hindrance!

We cannot **change** until we **move on** and **move forward**, until we get **emotionally unstuck** from yesterday's **thinking and yesterday's** living. Then and **only** then can we **pursue God's vision** of who we are **meant** to be as **His people**!

How did we become emotionally stuck?

The Old Testament is **greatly undervalued**. In the Old Testament are these **incredible stories** about the **power of faith**. For example in Exodus, there is **one story** of **how faith** can **set us free** from **our emotional bondage**.

Right in the **middle** of this Exodus story is the parting of the Red Sea in Exodus 14. It shows us what it means to be **emotionally stuck**. The Israelites were in **a difficult position**.

On **one side** was the **Egyptian army**, closing in on the Israelites; while on the **other side** was the **Red Sea. There** was no easy way out!

Their choices were to be captured by the Egyptian army **or** drown in the Red Sea, which really was no choice at all.

But that is exactly what it feels like to be **emotionally stuck**; there are absolutely no good choices so **we tend** to go back to what we know, which **is the familiar**. We want to be **in** a time before we were in this **binding situation**. **That is exactly how the Israelites felt.**

The Israelites were frustrated and so are we! The Israelites said they never really wanted to be free from Egypt, and they wished they could go back to where life to them was better. Israel was emotionally stuck in Egypt; they couldn't let Egypt go because of the fear of change!
